

When two teenage gangs start a silent fight... Thriller Granny and her two grandchildren turn into super detectives!






Loïc Le Borgne was born in 1969 in Rennes. Strongly attached to Brittany, he was a journalist in a regional newspaper for fifteen years. Meanwhile, he travelled the world with his wife to collect the material for all his novels, including *Les Enfants d'Eden* (*"The Children of Eden"*, Mango, 2006), *Je suis ta nuit* (*"I am your night"*, Intervista, 2008 and Livre de poche), *Hystérésis*, nominated for the 2015 Great Imaginary Award (Grand Prix de l'Imaginaire). He also wrote, under the pseudonym of Loïc Léo, a 12-volume series for children, *Le Club des chevaux magiques* (*"*The club of magical horses", Grund, 2010-2013 and France Loisirs). For *Agence Mysterium*, he chose a well-known scenery as he has a house near Saint-Malo.





He also wrote and illustrated numerous landmark comic books (*Androïdes, Mjöllnir, Les Elfes, Zombies, Les Maîtres inquisiteurs, Oracle, Lancelot, In Nomine, Nosferatu, La Guerre des Orcs, Assassin, Guerres parallèles, Kookaburra Universe, Shaman, Médicis*).



Attracted to short-term anticipation, they won the 2000 Alain Dorémieux Prize (Sci Fi literary Prize) for *Chroniques des Terres Mortes*. They also wrote about thirty short stories, published in anthologies and Sci Fi magazines such as *Europe*, and awarded the 2003 Great Sci Fi/Fantasy Prize (Grand Prix de l'Imaginaire). Two novels, *Mars Hérética* and *Épicentre* (awarded the 2008 « Une autre Terre » Prize at the Imaginales Festival – the greatest Sci Fi/fantasy festival in France), complete and extend their exploration of this universe made of contrasts.


